Principal's Report—June 22nd, 2009

With all the buzz at the moment about Australia qualifying for the World Cup, I hope that all parents saw the article in the Independent News this week about Somerville SC. FIFA testing of the synthetic turf soccer field now being complete. The testers were very impressed with verbal feedback suggesting that the field meets all the standards for at least FIFA 1 Star, if not 2 Star certification. During the June break FieldTurf Australia will be adding a few thousand kilograms of rubber in-fill to the field to account for any settling.

We have been formally notified that Somerville SC will receive \$200,000 under the Commonwealth Government's National School Pride initiative. During Term 3 the following projects will be completed as a result of the funding:

Complete installation of Hitachi Starboard Duo Interactive White Boards to each classroom

Additional student seating & tables, including some synthetic turf surrounds for use at recess & lunchtime.

Video Security upgrade to incorporate synthetic turf soccer field and surrounds 3 x class sets of "Quizdom" eLearning units

Shade sail for existing "teenrager" playground equipment.

I expect our successful National Secondary Schools Computer Fund application, another Commonwealth Program, to bring funding of \$100,000 (and later an additional \$70,000) into the school early Term 3. Funds will be used initially to purchase 3 more "Computers On Wheels" - 75 notebook computers on special trolleys - which will dramatically improve computer access for students in the school.

On Friday June 12, as well as completing report proofreading, all staff received training in the management of an anaphylaxis event. Parents aware of students who may suffer from such severe allergic reactions are advised to inform in writing our First Aid Officer - Sara Hyde – of the relevant details as soon as possible.

As we come to the end of Term 2 and enter Term 3 I would like to remind parents that all students in Years 7 & 8 participate in a "water safety" program as part of their Physical Education course. I ask that all parents support such activities, and other opportunities that the school organizes, by promptly returning permission forms and ensuring that students arrive at school with the appropriate gear.

Reports will be distributed this Friday, June 26th at the end of the school day. As is the norm, we do not conduct Parent - Teacher interviews in line with this reporting cycle. I advise any parents who are concerned about their child's progress to contact the relevant Form or Subject Teacher at the beginning of Term 3. Students will be dismissed at 2:30 after the distribution of reports. School resumes on July 13 with all students beginning new "electives". New individual student timetables will be distributed on Day 1. I wish everyone a safe and relaxing mid-year break.
